

### Freedom is participation in power. Choose to be free.

In October <u>Barack Obama said</u> "the threat to our democracy does not come from one person in the White House or Republicans in Congress or big money lobbyists. The biggest threat to our democracy is indifference." He is correct that indifference is a problem, but wrong on so many other levels. It's fascinating to me that this election has thrust this issue into the spotlight... indifference endangers our democracy, but the organized, naked, fascist efforts to remove voting rights shows how critically important our votes actually are...


Suppose you couldn't shake the feeling that as citizens we're obligated to vote, even if it does no good. Then, Red or Blue, Lib or Con, you should be appalled at the nationwide efforts to disenfranchise voters. These efforts take <u>many forms</u>; <u>gerrymandering</u>, <u>voting obstacles</u>, <u>felon</u> <u>voting laws</u>, <u>voter ID laws</u>, and others, but the worst may be the mass voting purges going on in

several states. The naïve may not be concerned because "their" vote isn't in danger; <u>it's "those" votes that are being purged</u>. But the people doing the purging don't care... any possibility of someone voting against them is a possibility they can't have, and the whole point of purging is to eliminate entire groups of people to stop the possibility of individual undesirable votes... *anyone* who tries to take the vote of *any* American is your enemy. Not all Republicans are part of the purges, but the Republicans who are part of it are your enemies, enemies of America, and enemies of Democracy. <u>When/if</u> the Democrats start purging they'll be our enemies too, but until then I don't see how rational, principled Republicans can stand with the vote thieves.

Purges and election restrictions are theoretically intended to 'ensure the security of our electoral system'. A laudable goal if true, but the 'problem' they're defending against doesn't exist and the solution they're proposing breaks the system rather than protecting it. <u>Study after study</u> has shown voter fraud does exist... in <u>rates of tens of fraudulent votes per billions cast</u>, not enough to swing any election. But the Republicans' proposed solution <u>disenfranchises tens of thousands</u> of people, far more than enough to affect results. This gives me yet another chance to brag on Oregon... for a secure system that also encourages participation, look no further than our mail-in voting system. Recognized as the easiest state to vote in the country, we customarily had high voting rates already but our 2016 "Motor Voter" law <u>increased participation from 64% to 68%</u>.

Our first-in-the-country vote-by-mail system (now joined by Washington and Colorado) is not only secure while voting, AND leaves an auditable trail, AND requires no time off to vote, AND has no voting lines, but it's easy. One of our clients sent us a picture of he and his friends gathered together in a bar to vote, creating "Vote by Pub"!

Roman Senator Cicero once said that "freedom is participation in power", and the word "idiot" was created by the Greeks to describe people who didn't (or couldn't) participate in public life,





content to live under laws and rules written by others whether or not they were in the interest of the idiot in question. In 2016 only about 36% of eligible voters chose to be free, leaving 64% who chose to be idiots. As America teeters on the brink of authoritarian fascism I hope our choice won't be whether to actively help dismantle democracy or stand meekly by while it happens. I believe we're better than a nation of idiots, I believe we're a nation of kings. Even if our kingship is shared, WE own the power to control our destiny... but ONLY if we participate in that power.

## <u>Wireless Dangers</u>

The questions, threats, science, and answers. Sort of.



In 2015, client Rodrige D.'s work with Environmental Electromagnetic Field (EMF) mitigation prompted us to write a short article on the issue. Recently he told us about "We Are The Evidence", an organization concerned with EMF Sensitivity and the threats of EMF Fields. Founder and director Dafna Tachover was in town and he offered to set up an interview with her. Of course, we jumped at the chance. As we were deciding what to pass along to you from our several hours of discussion we kept running into a fundamental question... EMF, its effects, and the solutions are controversial even within the scientific community. How do we, or anyone else, know whether a scientific concept is strongly established enough to take action on it? How does anyone determine if an issue is vapor or a real threat? We may not have a definitive answer for you, but we hope you'll find value in our search...

Two or three centuries ago it was at least theoretically possible for <u>one person to 'know' almost everything</u> in all fields of knowledge. The exponential expansion of knowledge now means a lifetime of education to probe the frontiers of any one field and necessarily ignoring the rest. No matter how much of an expert anyone is in their particular field, they're an idiot in most of the rest and there's no choice but to rely on other people to fill the gaps.

As a painfully relevant example, an auto shop may be spectacularly qualified to fix your car and still completely unqualified to render judgement on science or medicine. EMF field pollution and sensitivity are big issues but they're complex and unproven. They have implications for societal change and improvement if true and equal potential for scaremongering and damage if not. How do we know whether we're telling you about dangerous new health risks, or passing on mindless dismissals from corporate Quislings? Indeed, if we're going to write about any subject outside our expertise, how do we know we're providing any value at all?

The best answer is we don't know, and since we choose not to pretend we do, that became the basis for this article. Our dilemma strikes every person every day, whether they realize it or not- how do we form lucid opinions on issues when we have no choice but to rely on others? We'll tell you what we learned about EMF, what some of the arguments against it are, and what some of the fixes might be, and hopefully that will be valuable. But the biggest value of this article might be an exploration of how anyone makes evaluations about anything at all...

#### The annoying process of science

Science doesn't tell us what's true. It tells us what's NOT true, and we build our reality from what's left. As science progresses it uses what it 'knows' from the past to learn about the present and future. It's a process we've seen play out many times but it IS a process, not an event... there's no 'finish line' where something gets declared objectively, scientifically 'true'.

Consensus on such things as geocentrism, atomic theory, germ theory, and relativity theory is so strong that we laugh at the cranks who go against them, but they were each crackpot ideas when introduced and new facts and understanding of reality could change any or all of these 'truths' at any time. All scientific ideas have a provisional doubt that fades (never completely) as evidence accumulates. Smoking is known to cause cancer even through there was 'doubt' for decades, and thalidomide is gone even though it was once thought to be safe. But other ideas are still going through the process. Evolution and climate change are about as well-understood as any other scientific theories, but there are still loud doubters. Anti-vaxxers still protest though science has examined and rejected their claims. Fluoridation may be viewed with suspicion but little evidence of actual damage. Still other ideas seem to have some legitimacy, but no definitive explanations. What about 9/11 illness, Gulf War syndrome, GMOs, DU Birth defects, Cuban embassy headaches, or a litany of other issues? We keep exploring and testing, trying to find the diamonds in the glass.

#### What are the basics of EMF Sensitivity?

EMF Sensitivity seems to be beyond the beginning of scientific evaluation, but not yet to the point of consensus. EMF is <u>electromagnetic radiation</u>, the waves of energy from normal phenomenon. It covers everything from low energy radio waves, through visible light, and on through high-energy x-rays and gamma rays. EMF is nothing new; we're bathed in a sea of it from the moment we're conceived from sources like the sun, the Earth's magnetic field, lightning, and more. In our modern world EMF comes from electrical devices like cell phones, wi-fi, cell towers and antennas, tablets, cordless phones, wireless "smart meters", powerlines, appliances, and imbalanced home wiring among other sources.

While EMF is radiation, it's not the same as radiation from sources like uranium or plutonium. We now understand that radiation from these substances causes damage at a cellular level when high-energy particles knock out other particles in the cell's nucleus, sending a "free radical" out to damage the cell and cause a chain reaction. While EMF seems to be connected to a variety of tumors and cancers, it seems unlikely it could cause these problems through the same mechanism as classical radiation... the EMF waves just don't have enough energy to disturb the cellular particles.

#### What are the effects of EMF sickness?

Surveys conducted through 2006 indicate that 10% of the population was suffering from EMF sickness. Symptoms of exposure vary according to individual susceptibility, duration and frequency of the exposure, and intensity of the source. Symptoms range from mild to severe, from acute to chronic, and can include headache, tingling in the hands and legs, pain in the head and ears when using a cell phone, cognitive problems, brain fog, heart palpitations, difficulty breathing, sleep disturbances, exhaustion, tinnitus, nose bleeds, dizziness, and nausea.

Beyond symptomology there is evidence of physical damage. The fullest review to date of the scientific studies on EMF harm comes from the 2012 <u>Bio-Initiave Report</u>, but studies are uncovering specific mechanisms of harm. A <u>2015 study</u> conducted on about 700 people with ES symptoms indicated serious physiological damage to the blood-brain barrier, hypothalamus and immune system, as well as neurodegeneration. A <u>2016 US Government study</u> found EMF caused both tumors in glial cells in the brain as well as malignant schwannoma of the heart. <u>Additional studies</u> have confirmed these as well as general increase in cancers and tumors in the larger population. EMF has also been implicated in <u>sperm damage</u>, <u>autism</u>, and <u>ADHD & behavior disorders</u>. New research on EMF and its causes is ongoing; just as we were finishing this article we found <u>a new study linking EMF to cancer</u> in rats.

#### What's the deeper story on EMF sickness?

#### **Critiques of EMF research**

There's lots of research on EMF to date with more on the way, and of course there's critiques of all the research. As with the EMF research itself, some is good and some is bad. Most of the good critique comes in the form of "you haven't demonstrated causality" which is critical before EMF can be diagnosed, treated, or prevented. That can be a solid critique, but goes too far when it continues in to "therefore there is no problem." Not *knowing* the causality is not the same as there not *being* causality.

#### SPIN vs FACT: National Toxicology Program report on cancer risk from cellphone radiation

The National Toxicology Program (NTP) of the National Institutes of Health reported partial findings from their \$25 million study of the cancer risk from cellphone radiofrequency radiation (RFR). Controlled studies of rats showed that RFR caused two types of tumors, glioma and schwannoma. The results "...could have broad implications for public health." Below are some biased statements, or "Spin," about the study that tend to create doubt about data quality and implications, as well as "Facts" from decades of previous research.

Conclusions are faulty. Dr. Michael Lauer, deputy director for extramural research at the National Institutes of Health, "I am unable to accept the authors' conclusions." #### What you can do... and not do

There's strong *evidence* that EMF causes health problems, but not yet definitive *proof*. How should we, societally or individually, act in the face of unproven threats? We could overreact and panic, shutting down wireless technology altogether or locking ourselves in mobile Faraday cages to block EMF completely, on the *possibility* that EMF is dangerous. A more appropriate societal response may have to wait for clearer science and on cooperation between companies and nations, but there are very simple steps we can take as individuals in the meantime to protect ourselves without giving up the 21<sup>st</sup> century technology we love.

#### What you SHOULD do

These are simple, common-sense solutions that seemed common across all sources. They're either cheap or free, and will definitely reduce the EMF from point-sources

- Limit exposure to EMF when possible •
- Switch off EMF-generating devices whenever possible •
- Move furniture as far away as possible from EMF sources •
- Replace wireless devices with wired alternatives •
- Use corded headphones instead of BlueTooth headsets
- Use shielded, grounded extension cords

If you think EMF is a more critical problem for you personally there are more in-depth solutions. These may involve an evaluation of your home or work to determine sources of EMF you're personally exposed to.

#### What you MIGHT do

EMF-protectant cloth is available, as blankets or ready-made clothing. A shield will work to stop most emissions from one direction but does nothing to stop the EMF coming in from other directions. Nevertheless, it might be helpful in blunting EMF from devices like laptops.

Sara Novak on Treehugger, Feb 2012 Maternity clothing made with "silver ions" that claim to protect unborn babies from daily doses of electromagnetic radiation can actually increase the wearer's exposure from sources like mobile phones according to Chinese experts.

#### What you SHOULDN'T do

Since the science and threat are ill-defined, there are inevitably hucksters out there selling snake oil to solve it. While there is the philosophical possibility these gadgets may work we're gonna go out on a limb and say there is no theory, extrapolation from theory, or even rumored hypothesis that would enable these things to have any effect on EMF pollution. Things like these are as effective as rabbits' feet... don't get suckered.

- BioShields- "This Bio Shield comes in the form of an attractive pendant which can be worn around your neck. Designed as a personal EMF shield the pendant encases a special matrix of crystals which refract a wide spectrum of EMF Frequencies."
- EMF Blues- "While most EMF Protection Devices on the market are aimed at blocking or shielding EMFs, Crystal Catalyst® Resonators go one step further! These ceramic resonators harmonize electromagnetic frequencies so they are no longer harmful to your body. This makes them powerful EMF Protection Devices AND Life Energy Enhancers."
- Waverider EMF blocker- "The WaveRider mitigates the harmful effects of manmade EMR from all our devices and alters the pattern to mimic a more natural "white noise" type of wave that the human body can tolerate... without changing the actual structure of the EMF." (and it's a steal at only \$997)

#### What if I just don't give a damn?

If you've lived this long without developing EMF sensitivity, it's either complete BS or you have a high enough tolerance that it hasn't affected you. If it's BS there's obviously nothing to worry about. If it's not, your tolerance may not protect you. Aging increases sensitivities to environmental factors so the level that didn't make you sick today could cripple you tomorrow. But also, the amount of EMF you're exposed to is about to increase. The new 5G standard for wireless is already being built, and the experiment will be run on us all. Whether we give a damn or not.


#StandOnEveryCorner is a growing national movement of people coming together to hold regular, peaceful, family-friendly protests in their own neighborhoods.

A look inside the dark, dank, dungeons of Dwyer



In this Halloween Season we're all about fear, and for some people there's nothing scarier than a trip to the mechanic. That fear can be justified because take it from us, some scary stuff rolls through our doors. If you're in the mood for some Halloween shivers then you'll enjoy this selection of Automotive Horror stories. You'll find mummies, stakes through vital organs, kittens in peril, bodies torn apart, ghostly brakes, and one of our favorite stories of a car brought back from the grave. Most are from our shop but all are true, and the ALL HAVE PICTURES! So turn up the scary music, turn down the lights, huddle up close, and prepare to be automotively terrified...

#### Horror Is Always Just Around The Corner

Before moving to the uniquely ghastly we'll start with the commonly awful... this is what we have to do to your vehicle every time we repair things deep inside. The top pictures show a van in for an engine replacement. The second set is even worse, showing the dismembered body of a Honda Pilot in for a heater core repair. Why worse? While it's not surprising that new engines are major any vehicle. small surgery for and inexpensive heater cores can generate the same horrifying bill. These systems are 'just behind the firewall', and it's necessary to remove the entire steering and dash assemblies to get to them, meaning many hours of labor are needed to change a relatively inexpensive part. Scary!



#### The Mummy



If you're a rat, your dream house is something dry, warm, and safe from predators. Unfortunately, that also describes a car's engine. We occasionally find rats, mice, chipmunks, and other little furry creatures that have made a bad choice in real estate and paid for it with their lives. Here's one that briefly made its home behind the vehicle's bumper. Not much to say about this other than it's vaguely interesting and that odd smell from your vehicle may not always be mechanical.

#### **Haunted House**



The Mummy Mouse above was a loner just passing through but we frequently run into vehicles that have become long term haunts for whole families of spiders, rats, and mice. These pictures come from a vehicle that had sat unused for years before the client decided to dust it off. The fairly elaborate rat nest in the manifold was an obstacle at first, but we were able to exorcise the evil spirits rodents and get him back on the road again.

#### **Kitten in Peril**

Our "Rodent of the Month" (the Mummy, above) made for our most popular Shop Talk column ever so we immediately followed up with this story about what happens to an <u>adorable fluffy kitten that takes a 1000-mile trip... INSIDE a car's engine</u>. (Spoiler Alert: the story has a happy ending.)



#### Chipmunk On The Brink Of Extinction



Animal rescue really hit home at the shop when we were faced with saving the life of an endangered chipmunk. Chipmunks aren't endangered, you say? This one was...

From the moment the Toyota Highlander slid into Andrew's stall he knew he was facing a unique problem. The owners had seen evidence of rodents partying in their vehicle, but when they tried to break it up the rodents scattered like... well, like mice. Most got out but one took a bad turn and got stuck in the windshield pillar, nestled against the side curtain air bag. After waiting unsuccessfully for him to leave, the owners brought the Highlander in to us before the squeaking stopped. Getting Chippy out was no problem, but getting him out alive? The clock was ticking. Andrew loosened the cowling and gently prodded the very dazed chipmunk into an ASPCA-approved transparent polymeric small-animal transfer container. The whole Dwyer team helped transport the chipmunk to his new home in the blackberry bushes lining the Springwater Corridor. As Andrew opened the transfer container the chipmunk staggered out to the tune of "Born Free", somewhat the worse for wear but ready to start his new life.

#### **Bodies Torn Apart**

An invisible killer stalks the highways and byways east of the Rockies, waiting silently on icy roads, reaching out to grab unsuspecting vehicles. Once it has a fingerhold it never lets go, and spreads a cancer through its victim that always ends in death. We're talking about road salt, and the aggressively frame-killing rust it causes. We're frequently asked to inspect vehicles that have escaped this terror of the East and all-too-frequently have to say it's time to part with the vehicle when we find rust... rust damage to a vehicle's frame can be deadly in an accident, and can sometimes kill the car without one. This picture isn't from our shop, but from another that tried to revive a truck with frame rust... somewhat unsuccessfully.



#### **Ghost Brakes**



The invisible killer of rust claimed another victim, but we stopped it before it claimed the driver as well. This was another vehicle that a client had just bought from back East (without a pre-purchase inspection). The Dealer had bought the car at auction and must have noticed the brake system had almost completely rusted away, because rather than fixing it before sale they re-hung the original calipers and left all the other remaining corroded parts in place. The driver was left with a ghostly reminder of where brakes should have been but no actual brakes that could have stopped their car! This was a potentially deadly situation and one of the scariest reminders of why PRE-PURCHASE INSPECTIONS FOR YOUR VEHICLE ARE SO CRITICAL.

#### Stake Through Vital Organs



We quickly figured out why the windshield washer system wasn't working; the end of the branch was a dead giveaway. The driver hadn't even noticed when the limb pierced through their grille, crushed their washer bottle, and broke off to be an unnoticeable little stub; they'd only noticed their washer had quit. The fix was quick and obvious, but the dismembered washer bottle was a conversation piece in our lobby for quite a while.

#### **Aliens Bursting From Stomachs**




Few things are scarier than tire problems because if a tire fails while you're driving then a "roadside breakdown" is one of the GOOD possibilities! That's why we were so glad this tire failed so dramatically, and in our shop instead of on the road. The manufacturing defect in the sidewall popped out as soon as we aired it up but there was no help... it was off to the tire graveyard. (Just FYI, it's usually possible to repair punctures on tires if the puncture is ON THE TREAD AREA. If it's on the sides of the tire, it can't be repaired and you're going to have to buy a new tire.)

#### **Zombie Car Returns From The Grave**



This is the best kind of horror story, one with a moral that can help us all, but beware... it's not for the faint of heart! A client (who we'll call "Mr. X") brought their vehicle in with a check-engine light, power loss, rough idle, and a severe oil leak. The vehicle had been running fine until all of a sudden the problems hit. We put the car on the rack and quickly diagnosed a leak in the valve cover gasket, likely caused by pressure building in the engine and pushing out the gasket. A little investigation gave more insight. Mr. X was overdue for an oil change... 20,000 miles overdue! Luckily, Mr. X brought the car in immediately before more major damage was done. We were able to clean the sludge off of the internal components, but not before we took the

graphic and horrifying pictures below...



#### **Before**

Over the miles, the engine oil had broken down into its basic parts and formed a tar-like black sludge that coated the entire engine. The first two pictures show the top of the engine with the valve cover removed. The sludge had packed the engine such that the engine parts and oil had to fight through the goo in order to move. The second picture shows just how thick that goo was... that screwdriver is stuck into the sludge about 1½ inches!



#### After

It took a while, but we were finally able to clean everything out. In the third picture you can see the moving parts that were covered by the burnt oil. The last picture shows that same chamber that had the screwdriver stuck into it, now clean as a whistle. Once again, this is an engine that's ready to run cleanly and efficiently.

## Shrimp Scampi Roll-Ups



Hate to say it, but Thanksgiving is on the way. We're not giving you recipes for turkey or mashed potatoes, but if you're looking for a unique side dish that will steal the spotlight from the stars? Drew's got you covered...

#### Shrimp Scampi Roll-ups

#### Ingredients:

- 3 Tbsp butter
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 Tbsp all-purpose flour
- 2 1/2 cups whole milk
- ¼ cup freshly chopped parsley, plus more for garnish
- Pinch of crushed red pepper flakes
- ½ cup dry white wine
- 1 ¾ cup shredded mozzarella, divided

- ½ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 lb. large shrimp, peeled and deveined, roughly chopped
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 10 cooked lasagna noodles
- 2 cups ricotta

#### **Preparation**:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large skillet over medium heat, melt butter. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute, then add flour and whisk until combined and golden, 1 minute more. Stir in milk, parsley, and a pinch of red pepper flakes and let thicken, 2-3 minutes. Add wine, ½ cup mozzarella, and Parmesan, and season with salt and pepper. Add shrimp and cook until pink, about 2 mintues more. Stir in lemon juice.
- 2. On a large baking sheet, lay out cooked lasagna noodles. Spread a thin layer of sauce in a large baking or casserole dish. Spread each with a layer of ricotta, then top with a thin layer of scampi mixture. Roll up and spoon more sauce on top of roll-ups. Sprinkle with remaining ¾ cup mozzarella.
- 3. Bake until golden and melty, 20 minutes. Broil 2 minutes if you want the tops to look golden.
- 4. Garnish with parsley and serve.

## <u>Health Notes</u>

## The Neuroscience of Pain



"Rate your pain on a scale of one to ten". If you've never been asked that question you're lucky, but most of the rest of us have heard it at least once. Vital signs such as blood pressure, respiratory rate, temperature, or kidney function are quantifiable, but pain, no matter where it seems to originate, is 'all in your head'. It's totally subjective, and a host of factors can influence both the experience and reporting of pain levels. For example, while the 1-10 scale is trusted and about as accurate as other scales, it has inherent problems...

"The 2014 edition of the textbook "Nursing: A Concept-Based Approach to Learning" warned practitioners that Native Americans "may pick a sacred number when asked to rate pain," and that the validity of self-reports will likely be affected by the fact that Jewish people "believe that pain must be shared" and black people "believe suffering and pain are inevitable." Last year, the book's publisher, Pearson, announced that it would remove the offending passage from future editions, but biases remain common, and study after study has shown shocking disparities in pain treatment."



## "Anti-Intellectualism in American Life" by Richard Hofstadter



So many books from the past are getting a second read because of their resonance with our situation today. "<u>It Can't Happen Here</u>" by Sinclair Lewis or "<u>1984</u>" by George Orwell are classic examples. This month we bring you another in the canon of political philosophy, "Anti-Intellectualism in American Life" by Richard Hofstadter. It won the 1964 Pulitzer Prize for Nonfiction among many other awards, but ironically it was decrying the devaluing of intellectualism just as America was at the apex of its love affair with science and engineering. One shudders to imagine what Hofstadter would say if he could see the venomous tripe passing for intellectual debate today, but you don't have to wait for his critique of yesterday... just dig in!



#### Anti-Intellectualism in American Life

"Twenty-first century philistines, suffering from a lack of imagination and curiosity, have seized upon understandable economic anxieties since the financial crash of 2008, to shepherd an increasingly large flock of American sheep into the livestock freight carrier Pulitzer prize winning historian, Richard Hofstadter, called "anti-intellectualism."

Anti-Intellectualism in American Life—one of Hofstadter's best, among many great books – was a pile of dynamite in 1963, when it was first published and blew a sizable hole in the house of America's self-comforting delusions of intellectual superiority. In 2014, one can only hope that some of its initial blast still reverberates, as media

commentators, university administrators, and even the President, have exposed themselves as adherents to what Hofstadter indicted as the "lowest common denominator criterion" of thought and "technician conformity" of lifestyle. Suspicion, and often outright hatred, of ideas is making American culture as riveting as oatmeal. By reading Hofstadter, one learns that the resurgence of a new anti-intellectualism isn't new, at all. In fact, Hofstadter identified the particularly poisonous strain of the virus that now infects the American mind and kills the imagination.

Hofstadter wrote Anti-Intellectualism in American Life after observing, with dismay and disgust, how the Republican Party, much of the media, and many Americans insulted and mocked Adlai Stevenson as an "egghead" throughout the 1950s when the former Governor of Illinois, ran for President. The result is a book of "personal passion", to use its author's words, that traces the ugliness of anti-intellectualism throughout American history. From the populist stupidity of glorifying the everyman, while denouncing the expert, to the superstition of religion, and the excessive egalitarianism of the left, the country founded by men of Enlightenment, is often dim.

Anti-intellectualism, according to Hofstadter, is a "resentment of the life of the mind, and those who are considered to represent it; and a disposition to constantly minimize the value of that life." He was very clear in his insistence that Americans are not dumb. There is great intelligence in Americans, just as there is great professionalism. The problem is that professional intelligence is mechanical and functional – utilitarian. It is about the completion of an assignment, and the execution of a formula. Due to it having the operative mode of a machine, the preferred way of exercising the mind, for many Americans, takes on what Hofstadter labeled "mediocre sameness." There are only so many ways to do a job, and since many Americans learn at a very young age, that their entire lives are about the job they will one day have, they begin to think with the variety of appliance assembly methods in an instructional manual…"



#### Can Self-Driving Cars Solve Ethical Dilemmas?




*from* <u>Science Daily</u>- A massive new survey developed by MIT researchers reveals some distinct global preferences concerning the ethics of autonomous vehicles, as well as some regional variations in those preferences. The survey has participants from over 200 countries weighing in on versions of a classic ethical conundrum, the "Trolley Problem", which involves scenarios in which an accident involving a vehicle is imminent, and the vehicle must opt for one of two potentially fatal options. "The study is basically trying to understand the kinds of moral decisions that driverless cars might have to resort to," says Edmond Awad, lead author of a new paper outlining the project. "We don't know yet how they should do that."

#### **Uncle Sam's Achilles Heel... Hackable Weapons**



from <u>Washington Post</u>- Almost all of the U.S. military's newly developed weapons systems suffer from "mission-critical cyber vulnerabilities," a review of government security audits conducted from 2012 to 2017 found, suggesting military agencies have rushed to computerize new weapons systems without prioritizing cybersecurity... "From 2012 to 2017, DOD testers routinely found mission critical cyber vulnerabilities in nearly all weapons systems that were under development," GAO researchers wrote. "Using relatively simple tools and techniques, testers were able to take control of these systems and largely operate undetected"...

#### New Faults on Mt. Hood Could Trigger "The Big One" in Portland



from <u>Willamette Week</u>- Geologists have discovered new faults on Mount Hood that could trigger a highly destructive earthquake in the Portland area. The faults are separate from the Cascadia subduction zone, which for nearly a decade scientists have warned could cause a massive earthquake dubbed The Big One. There is an "extensive network of geologic faults extending north and south of Mt. Hood," that could "generate large earthquakes and may pose a significant hazard to surrounding communities, critical infrastructure, and even the city of Portland." Researchers predict the faults could trigger a 7.2 magnitude earthquake, larger than the Loma Prieta earthquake hit the San Francisco Bay Area in 1989...
