





Some have chosen to be temporarily laid off while others are working at vastly reduced hours in a meticulously semi-sterile shop. Though it's nothing compared to the sacrifices being made by the thousands of CRITICALLY essential people in the medical field, I feel proud that our team is braving a real risk to keep our company together and bring safety and value to our clients. I understand and appreciate that our clients are braving that same risk to deal with us, or any company! We'd ALL rather be home with our families during this worrisome time. Yet I also realize the privilege of working at all when so many people have lost their jobs, when so many businesses are closing, when the economic foundation of our entire global society is threatened. I, along with everyone else, at every level, am trying to balance my obligations to family, business, and community. I hope I'm making the right choices. It's not business as usual, but for now it's business, and we'll keep you posted as things change. Thank you.

We WILL get through this... we actually have no choice about it... but everything will be different afterward. The Coronavirus is shining a spotlight on fundamental faults in our system because it's easy to understand and hard to ignore. It's not the desperate children of a rigged economic system being sent to die overseas to support that same system; that's happening 'over there' and it's mostly those brown heathens dying anyway. Corollavirus is coming! YOU'RE ready for the pandemic, but what about your vehicles?

"Prepared. I'd have to say we're prepared," said Tom Dwyer, when asked about his company's response to the Coronavirus. "We're not panicking. We're listening to the medical professionals and taking all appropriate precautions." But his face became grim as he continued. "As humans we care most about the effects on people, but as automotive professionals our biggest worry is the spread of the virus to our clients' vehicles." What? A virus that spreads to cars?

It's not talked about often in the mainstream media, but it's not news... most human diseases have their counterparts in the automotive world. YOU might be prepared for the pandemic, but here's what you need to know to make sure your vehicle survives with you...

What are automotive viruses?

The idea of automotive viruses may be new to some people, but automotive medical professionals have been dealing with their insidious effects for years. Dr. Paul Ersatz of the Oregon Auto-Medical Response Team (OAMRT) gave us some background. "Most of the big disease outbursts in recent years have had

corresponding automotive variants. MERS hit Mercedes and SARS was hard on Saabs", he said. "When the H1-N1 virus hit in 2009 it was devastating to Hummers, but since they weren't widely distributed in the population it didn't have much of an impact. The Corollavirus is really just a variation of the Cordobavirus that struck American-made cars in the late 70's."

"Because people and their cars have such a close association, human diseases often mutate and move on to strike the automotive population", Dr. Ersatz explained. "Human viruses enter a vehicle with the driver and collect on surfaces like steering wheels and dashboards. Every vehicle model forms its own unique micro-climate from exhaust fumes, chemical outgassing, heat buildup, and

moisture condensation, but all are virtual petri dishes for accelerating mutation. Natural selection tailors each virus for the type of vehicle it evolved in, so while these viruses are almost impossible to remove from their 'home' vehicle environments they're also unlikely to jump from one car model to another."

How can you protect your vehicle?

Dr. Ersatz says a good rule of thumb is "if it's good for you then it's good for your car". Most of the advice from CDC on controlling human coronavirus has parallels in fighting automotive corollavirus.

Maintain social distance- 6 feet or so is appropriate for humans, but vehicles need a little more space. Leave at least 100 feet between other cars in traffic.

- Avoid large gatherings- Sports and entertainment events are being closed across the country, and
- your vehicle isn't immune. Locally, Oregon is cancelling traffic jams and congestion in areas like the I-5/I-84 interchange and the Columbia River bridge, while Washington is completely shutting down I-5 from Tacoma to Seattle. Traffic is expected to return to hell as soon as the medical restrictions are lifted.
- Wash your hands- Humans need soap and water for 20 seconds (the time it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice) but your car needs much more. Plan a full scrub with Purell Foaming Car Wash (or equivalent) while singing "Bohemian Rhapsody". Do this 4-6 times a day.
- Avoid Contact- PLEASE, no fender benders for the duration of the emergency! Don't hit any other vehicle

without proper preparation! If you MUST have an accident, drive to an empty parking lot and douse both cars with Purell Foaming Pre-Accident Protectant. From there, you can smash into each other in isolation and safety.

 Wear Masks- Everyone is hoarding surgical masks though they do very little to actually protect the wearer from infection. However, masks are VERY helpful in preventing transmission to other people and vehicles! Panic buying of automotive surgical masks has cleared the shelves of most shops, but not at Tom Dwyer Automotive. If you need a surgical mask for your vehicle, count on us. Our supply of masks is just as stable as it has been for years.

but they'll prevent it from infecting others. If you need one, don't worry... our supply of auto surgical masks hasn't been affected by panic buying.

Stay safe out there!

The Trump administration's incompetent response to Coronavirus is dwarfed by their absolute refusal to even admit Corollavirus exists at all. If you take their word for it, Corollavirus isn't a threat and we can pretend the whole thing doesn't exist. But just as with Coronavirus, we're learning to look past the 'leaders' and pay attention to the experts. Dr. Ersatz' best advice for surviving this pandemic? "Don't panic", he said. "Take appropriate precautions and be careful, but realize this isn't the end of the world. We'll get through this thing together. As for me, I'm taking Steve Mnuchin's advice... I'm going to go buy stock and keep the economy afloat!"







Our Coronavirus response!



There's only one issue anyone's Talking about at our Shop this month... Coronavirus. Here's what we have to say on it...



Things are tightening down even more as Coronavirus threatens the health of our citizens and the economy of our country. We'll continue to update you, as appropriate, on our response here at the shop to a rapidly changing world.

WE ARE AN ESSENTIAL BUSINESS. WE ARE STAYING OPEN.

Governor Kate Brown's closure order (<u>read it here</u>) affects many businesses, but 'essential' businesses can remain open if they institute mandatory social distancing policies. Gas stations and repair shops are on the list of 'essential' businesses because transportation, even in a locked-down world, is critical. We are staying open because safe and reliable vehicles are at least as important as the gas to run them. We will be reducing our hours slightly during this crisis, so our new TEMPORARY hours are:

9a-6p Mon-Fri and 10a-1p on Sat.

We'll notify you again when these hours will change back to normal.

You have non-contact options for pickup and dropoff

- You have many options for pickup, dropoff, and scheduling, including curbside service
- Most tasks, including scheduling, service review, and payment can be handled over the phone at 503-230-2300 or online at TomDwyer.com. We are ALWAYS available by phone for ANY question or concern you have.
- We're encouraging you to use our after-hours key drop for curbside service during regular hours. When you arrive you'll take an envelope from the Key Drop box (just to the right of the office door), put your keys in, sign the envelope, and call your Service Advisor from outside the shop. Your Service Advisor will give you instructions from there. If you think you'll want to use this option, please tell your Service Advisor so we'll be expecting your keys.
- We are offering **pickup and dropoff at your home or business**. If you can be flexible with your appointment scheduling we can pick up your vehicle at your home or work, bring it here for service,

and return it to you when it's finished. If you think you'll want to use this option, **please tell your Service Advisor** when you schedule your appointment so we can arrange staff appropriately.

• We offer 6-months or 12-months-same-as-cash (OAC) if you can't pay right now.

We are implementing even stricter cleaning protocols.

In the office

- You'll see our Service Advisors using hand sanitizer before dealing with each client.
- Your **keys will be sanitized** before they're returned to you.
- We're now **cleaning office hot spots** like door knobs, handles, bathrooms, common surfaces, the PIN pad, and the sales counter throughout the day with alcohol sanitizer.
- We've just added HEPA air filtration systems in the lobby to reduce airborne viruses
- We have **hand sanitizer available in our lobby** for your convenience. Clients can refill their own small hand sanitizer pumps from our supply at no charge.

In the shop

- We are **reducing staff temporarily** to reduce transmission and deal with reduced work load.
- Technicians normally wipe down their individual work areas and use surgical gloves while working. They're adding **sanitizing of common equipment** as well.
- **To protect our Technicians**, we will sanitize your vehicle before service. Our Technicians will use hand sanitizer and personal protective equipment while working on your vehicle.
- **To protect you**, we will sanitize your vehicle after service. Our Post-Service-Check now includes an interior sanitizer misting plus a sanitizer wipe down of your steering wheel, shift lever, door handles, controls, and all surfaces that may have been touched during your vehicle service.

We will cater to your individual needs.

If there's something we haven't thought of that's keeping you from having your vehicle serviced during this difficult time, then **PLEASE tell our Service Advisors**! They will be happy to accommodate you if at all possible.

<u>Drew's Kitchen</u>

Creamy Lemon Pork Chops



Drew's got a requirement for this month's recipe... it requires an Instant Pot Pressure Cooker, about \$79. But this mouth-watering recipe will be worth the buy-in!

Ingredients:

- 6 boneless pork chops, abt 1" thick
- 1/3 cup all-purpose flour
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 tbsp butter
- 8 oz baby bella mushrooms, sliced

- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- ¾ cup low-sodium chicken broth
- ¼ cup heavy cream
- ¼ cup freshly grated Parmesan
- 2 cups baby spinach
- Juice of ½ lemon

Preparation:

- 1. Season pork chops generously with salt and pepper, then dredge lightly in flour.
- 2. Set Instant Pot to 'sauté' setting and heat oil. When oil is shimmering, add pork chops in a sing layer, working in batches if necessary. Cook until golden on both sides, about 3 minutes per side
- 3. Remove pork chops and add butter. Once melted, add mushrooms and cook until softened, about 4 minutes. Stir in garlic and cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds. Add broth and use a wooden spoon to scrape up any browned bits on the bottom of pan.
- 4. Stir in cream and Parmesan, then return pork chops to Instant Pot. Lock lid and set Manual on high for 10 minutes. Follow manufacturer's guide for quick release, making sure to wait until cycle is complete before unlocking and removing lid. Let pork chops sit in sauce, uncovered, for 10 minutes.
- 5. Remove pork chops, then stir in baby spinach and lemon juice, letting spinach wilt slightly.
- 6. Serve pork chops with sauce.
- 7. If using newer versions of Instant Pot, especially 8-quart capacity models, we recommend removing the inner pot and letting it cool off for 5-10 minutes before moving on to the pressure cooking stage. This will help prevent a potential burn warning.



It's been 40 years since Alvin Toffler published this groundbreaking book, and the insights it offers have never been more relevant. Though he was writing at the dawn of the internet and computers, Toffler has remained a shining light on today's society because he looked deeper than the beeps and bangles.

Toffler drew conclusions about the way society itself was structured, and saw deep patterns in the way we deal with the world. His description of human civilization in three phases- agrarian, industrial, and information ages- wasn't groundbreaking. Neither was the observation that change was happening particularly new. No, it was the observation that the *pace* of change is changing, that society is changing faster than we have been able to keep up with. And it *may* be changing faster than we can keep up with.

Toffler isn't a rose-glassed futurist spinning Star Trek tales of Utopia,

though there are touches of that in Third Wave. He's grounded in technology, sociology, and history, and offers a way to look at the world that makes sense of the largest trends in society. It may not be comforting but it is extremely clarifying, and we can recommend no better book for dealing with the reality of today.


