



## **Tom's Tidbits**

## The other plague we can't escape

Greetings,

As I write this, the world is closing out its second year of Covid. In round numbers there have been about 5,350,000 deaths worldwide with about 800,000 of them hitting here in the US. In a country of about 330 million, that means .24% of our Fellow Americans have died. So far. But I want to focus on not on our dead, but on our wounded and how they can be healed.

Those 800,000 deaths came from about 50,900,000 Covid cases, meaning over 50,000,000 survived. So far. But those survivors aren't unscathed; about 250,000 required hospitalization during their illness and a significant (but unknown) number will be Covid Long Haulers who will require care for the rest of their lives. These are direct casualties of the disease but their wounds will be compounded by a shattered medical and political system.

Each Covid case is a spin of the wheel where the question is not IF the spinner will lose, but how badly. Death is just the (arguably) worst outcome. In 2020 <u>8.6 percent of Americans</u>, about 28 million of us, didn't have health insurance. That means 8.6% of those 250,000 hospitalized will be paying for their care out of pocket, and with very, very few exceptions, they'll be financially crushed. It's not much better for those with insurance. In a world where we're expected to be rational actors making life-and-death decisions on a price basis, there's no way to know what the price will be. The for-profit Insurance Companies and for-profit Hospitals set unpublished prices, negotiate between themselves out-of-sight, and send us a bill for whatever they settle on. The options are pay, go bankrupt, or die.

Covid means tens of thousands, hundreds of thousands of lives shattered, but of course, Covid is just the most visible mask on the same spectre. Cancer, Alzheimer's, Diabetes, Heart Disease, and more... the ghost of Medical Bankruptcy has haunted us all for decades. 62% of all bankruptcies in the US alone are for medical reasons, and worldwide there's... well... there aren't any. "As it turns out, medical bankruptcy is almost unheard of outside of the United States. Other developed economies (except China) have single-payer health care systems where medical costs are financed by taxes, not by premium-financed insurance. In these countries, there are no out-of-pocket costs for medical care and thus no bankruptcy caused by medical debts."

You might expect that if every other industrialized country on the planet has been able to figure out Universal Health Care, and the fact that we haven't places us with countries like Iran and Syria, there might be a reason. Maybe our way is better and we might be getting something more for our money. Nope. We pay more per capita for healthcare than any other country; roughly a third more than our nearest competitor (Switzerland) and roughly ten times as much as the lowest spender (Mexico), yet we consistently rank near the bottom on access to health care, equity and outcomes among high-income countries.

No, it's not that high quality demands high prices, it's pure greed by the for-profit Insurance providers who add no value to the system but stand as barriers between you and your health. Single payer is <u>politically popular with over 60%</u> supporting it in most polls. One might think the struggling Democrats, or the few sane Republicans trying to rebuild their party might ride this issue to popularity, yet they don't. Why? The Healthcare industry is the <u>biggest source of lobbying money</u>, <u>spending over \$500M this year</u> and almost <u>\$5 BILLION over the last 23 years</u>. "Follow the money", indeed.

Under our current system the literal Life, Liberty, and Pursuit of Happiness of every American depends on the fiat of corrupt lobbyists and politicians, and an American public too propagandized to see it or too demoralized to fight back. The same people who scream 'freedom' from their unvaccinated, unmasked throats scream 'socialism' just as loudly when someone proposes a single payer system. The same people who decry 'death panels' fail to see profit-driven executives using 'pre-existing conditions' as just that.

A worldwide pandemic is no one's 'fault'. Some people will die while others will be affected for life, and just like more conventional natural disasters, those shattered lives can be laid at Nature's doorstep. But the lives ruined financially are on us, our society, and the greed of insurance companies or the cowardice of politicians because we have thee power to prevent them... if we choose to use it. Single Payer!





#### **Referral Reward Program details**

For each new client you refer to us we'll donate 20% (up to \$50) of the qualifying purchases from their first invoice to the non-profit group of your choice.

We'll be thankful for everyone you send us, but oil changes, tires, and batteries won't count toward their qualifying purchases.

At the end of the year our clients vote on a Yearly Winner from all the groups we donated to through the year. We make an additional donation of \$1,000.00 to that cause.

The person you refer must have a 15-years-old-or-newer vehicle of a type we service. Sorry, but our 15-years-old-or-newer policy still has to apply, and we can't help with their Lamborghinis or semi-trucks. (We should remind you that the "15-years-old-or-newer" restriction applies ONLY TO NEW CLIENTS. If you're an existing client and we've been servicing YOUR older vehicle, we'll gladly continue to do so!)

Referrals don't have to come singly; you can coordinate your group to come in as a whole. In fact, we have a sample letter you might want to use to tell them about the program.

You can pick any group or organization, preferably with a 501c3 designation, but that's not required. They can be political, social justice, environmental, recreational, religious, educational, or any other purpose YOU care about.

We prefer (but don't require) donations to smaller groups. Big groups like the Red Cross, Mercy Corps, or Oregon Food Bank do amazing work. Many of our clients choose these groups and we gladly give to them, but our donations aren't huge (max \$50) and may get lost in the noise of their bigger donations. Smaller, usually local, groups don't have the operating budgets or ability to go fund hunting, and \$50 to these groups can be a huge boost.

#### Are there groups you WON'T donate to?

We reserve the right to say 'no' to any group for any reason, but we've only rarely had to do it. Our Referral Reward program is designed to thank YOU, so we do our best to donate to any group YOU care about. If for ANY reason we decide not to accept them we'll have you pick another; in the UNIMAGINABLE situation that we couldn't find ANY group you wanted to give to then we'd turn your Referral Reward into an in-shop credit for future services. Like we said though, our goal is to give to the people YOU think need it most.

We won't donate to a group that won't ACCEPT our donation. For example, several clients wanted us to donate to Bernie Sanders but the Bernie campaign isn't allowed to accept corporate donations (and Tom Dwyer Automotive is a corporation). We found a 'support Bernie' group instead, BerniePDX, which worked out even better... one client is now an active member of the group!

We won't donate to a group if we CAN'T FIND them. One client wanted to donate to a small relief group in Nigeria (which sounds like a scam, but turned out not to be). After several attempts over about two months we finally gave up and donated to Mercy Corps instead. International donations can be tricky; we'll

try if you want but we'll recommend a US-based (or at least large and well-known international) charity instead.

No one's ever asked and we don't expect our clients ever would, but we won't donate to hate groups. No KKK, Proud Boys, Nazis, or suchlike. If you want to pick one of these groups then you can go pound sand. We'll give you a coupon for an oil change at a Quick Lube (because we're still grateful for your referral) but you'll never hear from us again.


#### Why haven't I gotten a Referral Reward? I've referred lots of people!

First, we'd like to apologize... your word-of-mouth keeps our doors open, and we would love to be able to thank EACH person individually! Unfortunately, we don't always know who's doing the Referring. The only way we know how a new client found out about us is to ask them on their first visit, and we use their answer as their Referral source. Even if you sent someone to us they may not give your name as the Referrer. While they may have first heard about us through you, they may have later checked us out on Yelp or finally decided to come in just because we were convenient. 
These are the jokes, folks! Now all in one place.



## **Kyle's Kitchen**

### **Salmon Balls**



This month Kyle racked his brain trying to remember something that he ALWAYS had around the holidays. His mom came to the rescue with the recipe for his late grandfather's favorite appetizer, lovingly called "salmon balls". It's a smoked salmon dip formed into a large bowl to make it round, and Papa made it every single year without fail until he passed. It still brings him warm memories, and you can bet salmon balls will be on Kyle's table this year. We hope it brings warmth to your Holiday table as well.

#### **Salmon Balls**

#### **Ingredients:**

1- 16oz can salmon (drained and skin removed)

1-8 oz cream cheese softened

1- teaspoon of lemon juice

1- teaspoon of salt

2- teaspoons of grated onion

1- teaspoon of horseradish

1- teaspoon liquid smoke

#### **Ingredients:**

- Line a bowl with plastic wrap, enough to fold over the excess to pat down salmon mixture
- Mix all ingredients well and form into bowl lined with plastic wrap. Fold wrap over and push down to form a ball.
- Chill for a minimum of 1 hour to set. Remove from bowl, set flat side down on serving plate and pull wrap off slowly.
- Serve with crackers or veggies or both.

## Clear vision, now in an eyedrop



Presbyopia is a natural and annoying result of age and hardening of the cornea. In the past, your options for clear sight were 'reader' glasses, contact lenses, or surgery, but a new option is here. Miotic eye drops work by constricting the pupil to create a pinhole effect that increases the patient's depth of field, improving near vision. These new drops are described as fast-acting with long-lasting results, no decrease in distance vision, and very safe. Allergan's Vuity is the first to hit the market, but more are on the way. If magic vision drops seem interesting to you, here's some information to get you started. (You may need to pull out those cheater glasses to read it!)





#### Scientists Create Synthetic Organisms That Can Reproduce, MJ Banias in Futurist, Nov 2021

"Scientists have created synthetic organisms that can self-replicate. Known as "Xenobots," these tiny millimeter-wide biological machines now have the ability to reproduce — a striking leap forward in synthetic biology. Published in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, a joint team from the University of Vermont, Tufts University, and Harvard University used Xenopus laevis frog embryonic cells to construct the Xenobots. Their original work began in 2020 when the Xenobots were first "built." The team designed an algorithm that assembled countless cells together to construct various biological machines, eventually settling on embryonic skin cells from frogs..."

## <u>DARPA and NASA Scientists Accidentally Create Warp Bubble for Interstellar Travel</u>, Lauren Coontz on CoffeeOrDie, Dec 2021

"A Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency-funded research project at NASA's Johnson Space Center may have accidentally discovered how to build a warp drive engine. The scientists published their findings in July. Harold "Sonny" White, a NASA researcher at the Eagleworks Laboratory in Houston, Texas, published a research paper with his team in July about the "possible structure of the energy density present in a Casimir cavity." According to the report, the Eagleworks team came across "a micro/nano-scale structure ... that predicts negative energy density distribution that closely matches requirements for the Alcubierre metric." In other words, White and his colleagues accidentally created a microscopic experiment while researching how energy distributes around wavelengths — a theory developed by Dutch physicist Hendrik Casimir. The experiment resulted in enough theoretical energy to achieve "warp speed," a concept theorized by Mexican mathematician and physicist Miguel Alcubierre..."

#### 50 Years Ago, Scientists Caught Their First Glimpse Of Amino Acids From Outer Space, Maria

"Amino acids in a meteorite — from Science News, December 5, 1970

[Researchers] present evidence for the presence of amino acids of possible extraterrestrial origin in a meteorite that fell near Murchison, Victoria, Australia, Sept. 28, 1969.... If over the course of time their finding becomes accepted ... it would demonstrate that amino acids, the basic building blocks of proteins, can be and have been formed outside the Earth. Update- Scientists confirmed in 1971 that the Murchison meteorite contained amino acids, primarily glycine, and that those organic compounds likely came from outer space (SN: 3/20/71, p. 195). In the decades since, amino acids and other chemical precursors to life have been uncovered in other fallen space rocks. Recent discoveries include compounds called nucleobases and sugars that are key components of DNA and RNA. The amino acid glycine even has been spotted in outer space in the atmosphere of comet 67P/Churyumov-Gerasimenko. Such findings bolster the idea that life could exist elsewhere in the universe..."
